Do you have a little spare time, would you like to help others in need? We have volunteering opportunities at Pyrmont Cares. You could help taking information from the requests we receive, sorting donations and delivery items, or join our squad of pick up and delivery volunteers.

We can use men and women of pretty much any age, some roles require basic computer skills; we train all our volunteers. Heavy lifting is not required, as the truck has a lifting tail gate and we don't do stairs. You will be joining a great team of 50+ other volunteers. We collect Tuesday mornings and deliver Wednesday mornings.

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Martin Place Homeless.

I'm sure you will have seen that the Homeless community in Martin Place has been moved on. The usual practise when rehousing people is to place people in hostels and boarding houses, before moving people to permanent housing when support services are available. About 60% of rough sleepers need some form of support service. Often support services never become available and the rehoused no longer have a community to rely on and leave the temporary accommodation for rough sleeping again. Finland has been very successful in reducing its homelessness rate to almost zero by reversing the process and placing people into permanent accommodation pushing the support services keep up with demand. Sydney has adopted the Finish strategy of the 128 people rehoused from Martin Place 70 have gone into permanent accommodation and PCI has been hit by a wave of requests, The supply of furniture and electrical goods becomes critical to keeping the rehoused in their new permanent homes. PCI has responded to this by increasing our deliveries by two or three a week but we still have a backlog of 17 orders or 5-6 weeks. Agencies who might normally give us a request a month are submitting 6 requests at a time.

How can you help?

We need more furniture and more volunteers. We are fortunate to have 2 of Temple and Webster's management team help us each week for the last 5 weeks. However, this arrangement finishes on Wednesday and we are looking to increase the number of volunteers each Tuesday and Wednesday by one person to four.
